The Launch of the Cultural Database Project and Inclusive Economic Recovery Project

The Culture and Heritage Division of the Ministry of Tourism successfully held a Program on the 17th of November to launch two dominant Projects known:

1. Cultural Database
2. Inclusive Economic Recovery Project

The Cultural Database was initiated in 2019 and funded by UNESCO based on collecting relevant information about our traditions and culture. This is an important platform to accumulate the data and information collected. The Inclusive Economic Recovery Project was piloted in Tonga, Fiji, Palau, and Vanuatu. Four groups participated in this project which were the Seleka(Tavalivali), Onion Squad (modern dancer), Hu'ahulu, and craft makers. This project also focused on making Tongan crafts from coconut trees, Ngatu, and such.

Hon. Minister of Tourism and Foreign Affairs, Fekitamoeloa Katoa 'Utoikamanu was the Guest of Honor. In her speech, she stated how important this platform is to the future generation, as it will be a source of information that preserves our culture and traditions.

The Ministry was also delighted to have the presence of the General Secretary of Tonga UNESCO Mrs. Lucy Moala-Mafi, Rev. Tevita Tapueluelu, and other distinguished guests. The CEO of Tourism delivered the welcoming speech and ended the program with a heartfelt closing remark from the Director of the Culture and Heritage Division Mrs. Pulpaki Ika.

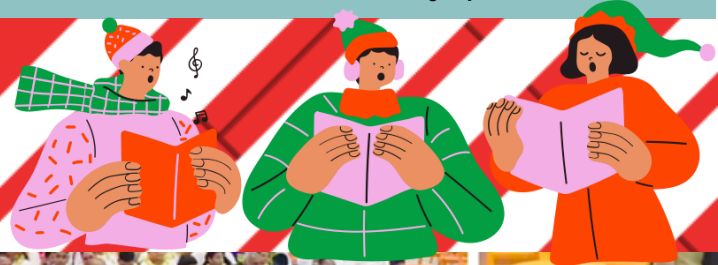

Ministry of Fisheries Highlights

NIWA Project Management Group (PMG) Meeting



The Ministry of Fisheries on the 8th November 2022, held a meeting with the National Institute of Water and Atmospheric Research (NIWA) Project. This project is funded by the New Zealand (NZ) Government, aiming to manage and develop the Deepwater Snapper Fisheries. The meeting was chaired and opened by the CEO for Fisheries, Dr. Tu'ikolongahau Halafihi. The CEO welcomed the PMG members who were representatives from the NIWA, SPC, NZ Ministry of Primary Industry (MPI), National Fisheries Council (NFC) and representative each from Vava'u and Ha'apai. The purpose of the meeting was to follow up on agreed actions from the last NIWA Project Management Group (PMG) meeting and to look at way forwards.

The PMG meeting is a progressive report meeting with the NFC and key Fisheries stakeholders on the progress of Phase II MOU. They discussed the way forward in ensuring the achievement of targeted Fisheries of the project, particularly Squids and Snappers. They also discussed the government assistance program which focuses primarily on vessels fishing for tuna and snapper and informed the PMG that 10 Deepwater Snapper vessels are now operating (up from 8 since the previous PMG). They were also updated on recent Deepwater landings, Squid fishing and landing, and other Fishery Diversification activities

30th November- International Year of Artisanal Fisheries and Aquaculture

The Ministry of Fisheries together with the Vava'u Environmental Protection Association (VEPA) NGO, held a day of celebration and awareness program for the International Year of Artisanal Fisheries and Aquaculture. The year 2022 has been declared as the International Year of Artisanal Fisheries and Aquaculture (IYAFA), with Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO)



as the leading agency, working in partnership with Pacific Island countries and regional organizations. IYAFA aims to highlight and enrich our understandings of the contributions of artisanal fishers and the aquaculture industry, and calls for our support and more actions towards national and global sustainable development, specifically, in relation to food security, nutrition, poverty eradication and the use of our natural resources. The celebration was to acknowledge IYAFA and the ongoing efforts and activities of artisanal fisheries and aquaculture within Tonga. The program was chaired and opened by Mr. Poasi Ngaluafe, Deputy CEO for Ministry of Fisheries, Science Division. Participants included representatives from schools, communities (Special Management Areas), small scale fishers and other relevant stakeholders. Mr. Ngaluafe reiterated the importance of the public sustaining artisanal fisheries and aquaculture and why we need to support their activities, as they play important roles as livelihood for the people of the Tonga.

The celebration involved presentations by the Government Ministries on topics such as SMAs, Fish Aggregating Devices (FADs), livelihood and well-being of Fishers, the importance of artisanal fisheries and aquaculture to food security and nutrition, the challenges & threats of climate change and the importance of biodiversity to artisanal fishers. Question-and-answer sessions were held amongst the participants and also a sharing of common knowledge and experience from fishers who attended the program with the intention of inspiring the younger generation represented from schoolsto be more involved in Fisheries and to improve livelihood in their respective communities.

The 19th Annual session of the Western Central Pacific Fisheries Commission (WCPFC 19)

The 19th Annual session of the Western Central Pacific Commission was held at the Royal Lotus Hotel, Da Nang, Vietnam on the 28th November until the 3rd December 2022. Tonga's delegation for this Annual meeting this year was led by Dr. Tu'ikolongahau Halafihi (CEO for Fisheries) and



was accompanied by Mr. George Vete (Project Manager, Tongafish Pathway project), Lavinia Vaipuna (Head of Offshore Fisheries Section), Mele Átuekaho (Deputy CEO) and Kilisitina Ákimeta (Media Officer). The objective of the Convention of the WCPFC is "to ensure effective management, long-term conservation and sustainable use of highly mandatory fish stocks in the Western and central Pacific Ocean in accordance with the 1982 United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea and the 1995 UN Fish

Stocks Agreement." Tonga ratified the Convention of the WCPFC in 2003 before it entered into force in 2004. The main purpose of the meeting is provided under the mandate of the Commission which is to "ensure the long-term conservation and sustainable use of the tuna fishery resources, of highly migratory fish stocks in the western and central Pacific Ocean for present and future generations". Tonga's participation in the Annual session of the Commission each year provide a clear indication of the high priority of the fisheries sector and the management of the highly migratory species to the Government of Tonga. It is also an opportunity for Tonga to raise priority issues in relating to the management of the tuna resources in our fisheries waters as well as holding bilateral meetings with other Commission members to support Tonga in the development of the tuna fisheries resources in our waters.

December 2022- First Official Handover of Donated Goods to the Ministry of Fisheries as part of the Non Project Grant Assistance From Japan.

The Ministry of Fisheries hosted an official handover ceremony on Monday, December 2022 at the Ministry's office in Sopu, to mark the first transfer of donated goods and equipment from the Government of Japan to the Ministry of Fisheries as part of a Non-Project Grant Assistance from Japan's Economic Social Development Program. This aid is worth \$1.3 million U.S Dollars and was formalized on May 27, 2022 by the government of Tonga and Japan, to assist the development of the Fisheries Sector and to support the relief from the eruption of the Hunga-Tonga Hunga Ha'apai volcano in early January this year. His Excellency, Mr. Munenaga Kensaku, Ambassador of Japan to Tonga solemnized the first delivery with the Acting Minister of Fisheries, Lord Fohe, the CEO of the Ministry Dr. Tu'ikolongahau Halafihi, with the presence of the Ministry's deputy CEO's. This first

shipment of laboratory equipment consisted of 20 tally counters, 10 diving computers, 4 underwater cameras and 3 water quality meters for the development of the aquaculture sector. These goods will prove much useful for aquaculture and fish farming and for other coastal fisheries research activities. The acting Minister of Fisheries Lord Fohe expressed profound gratitude and acknowledged the living generosity and love of the Government and people of Japan to the people of Tonga, bestowed through the Fisheries sector, as fish and Fisheries are an intergral part of our people's daily lives, with majority heavily dependent on our ocean resources for their basic livelihood. The CEO of the Ministry also conveyed the Ministry's deepest regards and hearty thanks to the government of Japan on behalf of the Government of Tonga for the immense contribution on to the growth of the Fisheries Sector. Dr. Halafihi thanked his Excellency for honoring

the day with his presence and for his commitment to this development project. He also conveyed the Ministry's appreciation to the Honorable PM Hu'akavaliku and the government of Tonga for their continuous support for the Ministry.

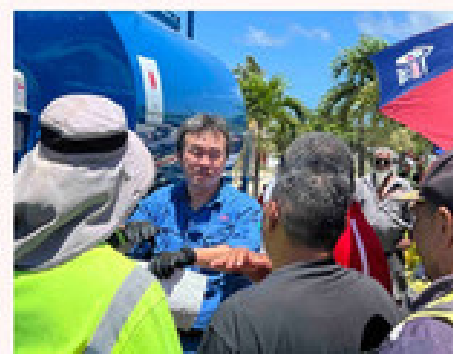
TRANSPORTING BUILDING MATERIALS TO THE OUTER ISLANDS

Although, it has been a rough on the contractors but they manage well with the help from the Ministry as well as other key partners in constructions. More houses will be build for those who were affected by the TSUNAMI.



CIVIL ENGINEERING STAFF TRAINING

On the 20th October 2022 The Hon. Prime Minister and Minister for Education, Hon. Hu'akavameliku and the Minister for Infrastructure, Hon. Sevenitini Toumoua witness the handing over of Japan's Aid to the Ministry. The Minister for Infrastructure signed the Inspection and Certificate of Receipt for 3 Units of Asphalt Distributor Trucks, 1 Set of Spare Parts, 27 Pcs of Spare Tires from the Ambassador of Japan to Tonga, His Excellency Mr. Kensaku Munenaga. Today, Civil Engineering Staff were trained to use these trucks as part of the Ministry's Development work.



WORLD BANK MONITORING TEAM

The TC RTP MOI Project Team visited to monitor the roadworks at the Loto Road from Fo'ui to Matahau. This World Bank funded road rehabilitation project will provide efficient road transportation for the nearby villages, as well as for those traveling to and from the eastern and western side of Tongatapu, and will be useful in times of evacuation during natural disasters

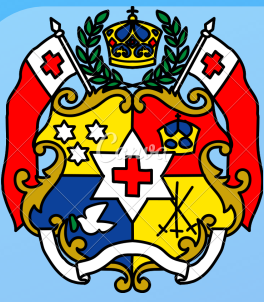


OPENING OF THE 'ATA'ATA #2 HOUSES

Farewell Dinner with Deputy Secretary Moleni Ika



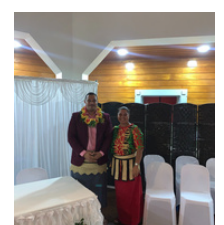
