TONGA PUBLIC SERVICE FRAUD POLICY

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The Public Service Commission, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4C of the Public Service Act 2002 [Cap 2.11], makes the following Order –

PART I PRELIMINARY

1. Short Title

This instruction may be cited as the *Tonga Public Service Fraud Policy*.

2. Principles

This Fraud Policy is guided by the principles of the *Public Service Act* [Cap 2.11] including but not limited to the requirements of Section 4C, the *Public Service Code of Ethics & Conduct*, and the *Criminal Offences Act* [Cap 4.04].

3. Purpose

The purpose of this Fraud Policy is to:

- (a) Provide clear procedures for reporting, investigating, and the discipline of employees who commit fraud in Government.
- (b) Define and specify the different types of fraud in Government.
- (c) Strengthen the Government framework for the prevention of fraud, in order to minimize the risk of financial, material or reputational loss arising from fraud.
- (d) Delineate the roles and responsibilities for fraud within the public service as per the *Public Service (Disciplinary Procedures) Regulations* [Cap 2.11.01], the *Public Service Code of Ethics & Conduct* [Cap 2.11.04], and the *Criminal Offences Act* [Cap 4.04].
- (e) Promote work procedures and information systems to ensure appropriate and timely action is undertaken to prevent or identify fraud when it happens.
- (f) Provide a clear and user-friendly reference document for both employees and the public in relation to fraud.
- (g) Promote, support, and maintain an ethical organizational culture across all levels of Government.

4. Interpretation

“bribe” means the giving, offering or acceptance of any money or valuable consideration of any description whatever by any person whether within or outside Government to any person in the service of Government as an inducement to do or abstain from doing any act in the execution of their duties as a Government servant or as an inducement to show favour or disfavour to any person.

“Chief Executive Officer” means any person in charge of the administration of a Ministry, who is employed under a fixed contract of employment under the *Public Service Act* [Cap 2.11].

“Code of Ethics & Conduct” means the *Code of Ethics & Conduct for the Public Service*.

“Commission” means the Public Service Commission established under the *Public Service Act* [Cap 2.11].

“employee” means all employees as defined by section 2(1) of the *Public Service Act* [Cap 2.11], and instruction 1A.3.1 and 2 of the *Public Service Policy Instructions 2010*.

“fraud” is the deliberate (knowingly/intentionally) practice of deception (whether by act or by omission, or misrepresentation or concealment) in order to receive unfair, unjustified or unlawful gain whether directly or indirectly, whether for oneself or for a third party. Fraud includes all forms of dishonesty whether for personal self-interest or for personal financial gain.

“Ministry resources” means all assets belonging to the Ministry including tangible and intangible things, monetary assets in all its forms, electronic, functional, social, and intellectual property. This includes a name, logo, stamp, forms, coat of arms, letterhead, and any property capable of being put into electronic form.

“MDAs” means Government Ministries, Departments or Agencies.

“Regulations” means the *Public Service (Disciplinary Procedures) Regulations 2010* [Cap 2.11.01], unless otherwise specified.

5. Policy Statement

- (1) The Government of Tonga does not tolerate any acts of fraud by employees.
- (2) Employees are required to conduct their work in a manner that is beyond reproach, and to perform their duties with honesty, integrity and transparency.
- (3) The Public Service Commission has a ‘zero tolerance’ approach to fraud. This means that the Commission and Ministries will pursue all allegations of fraud falling under the scope of this Fraud Policy. Appropriate administrative and disciplinary measures will be applied by the Commission for fraud that is substantiated through the processes provided by this Fraud Policy.

6. Scope

- (1) This Fraud Policy shall apply to all employees as defined by section 2(1) of the *Public Service Act*, and instruction 1A.3.1 and 2 of the *Public Service Policy Instructions 2010*.
- (2) This Fraud Policy may apply to persons listed under Schedule II of the *Public Service Act* or any other Government entity subject to any legislative amendments as may be required.

PART II FRAUD

7. Definition

Fraud is the deliberate (knowingly/intentionally) practice of deception (whether by act or by omission, or misrepresentation or concealment) in order to receive unfair, unjustified or unlawful gain whether directly or indirectly, whether for oneself or for a third party. Fraud shall include all forms of dishonesty whether for personal self-interest or for personal financial gain.

8. Types of Fraud

Types of fraud may be categorized as (but not limited to):

- (1) *Opportunistic Fraud* where an employee acting alone, or together with others, operating in any Government related work environment seizes an opportunity to commit fraud.
- (2) *Systemic Fraud* where fraud is endemic, entrenched in the system as the norm rather than the exception. Fraud could involve misappropriation of money or any Ministry resource, falsification of documents or fraudulent statements.
- (3) *Human Resources Fraud* can be part of systemic fraud, and covers payroll, nepotism in the recruitment process and the hiring (through abuse of process or lack of proper process) of unmerited individuals.

9. Steps for the Assessment and Identification of Fraud

Fraud is identified by the following three (3) steps:

- (1) Conducting an act or omission that is:
 - (i) dishonest;
 - (ii) outside of policy or procedure;

- (iii) biased;
- (iv) in breach of public trust;
- (v) in breach of a clear conflict of interest; or
- (vi) any act related to one's employment, duties, or functions.

(2) which is done in order to obtain or provide an unfair, unjustified or unlawful:

- (i) benefit;
- (ii) advantage;
- (iii) favour;
- (iv) goodwill;
- (v) gain; or
- (vi) any goods or service.

(3) which is:

- (i) direct or indirect;
- (ii) for oneself personally, or for any other party.

10. Specific Examples of Fraud by an employee

(1) The following are examples of past acts by Government employees which would be processed for possible fraud under this Fraud Policy:

- (a) Taking without right, stealing, misusing, using without authorization, embezzling, or misappropriation of any Ministry resources.
- (b) Knowingly providing false, incomplete or misleading information to any MDA.
- (c) Deliberate mishandling or misreporting money received or paid as part of any Government related financial transaction;
- (d) Unauthorized access and misuse of MDAs systems and information;
- (e) Misuse of or obtaining insider knowledge of organizational activities without appropriate implied or expressed consent.
- (f) Destruction, removal or inappropriate use of records, furniture, fixtures or equipment or any Ministry resources belonging to an MDA.
- (g) Forgery or alteration of any file or document whether in hard copy or e-copy, computer program or any record belonging to an MDAs.
- (h) Knowingly providing, assisting or validating in providing false misleading, incomplete or fictitious information to circumvent an MDAs procurement processes and procedures to avoid further scrutiny or reporting or manipulation of tendering or procurement processes;
- (i) Disclosing private confidential or proprietary information to outside parties without authorization;
- (j) Accepting or seeking anything of material value from contractors, vendors or persons providing services or materials to the MDAs;
- (k) Allowing a member of the public to influence them (a public servant) to use one's Government position in a way that is dishonest, biased or breaches public trust. This includes acting in violation of a clear conflict of interest.
- (l) Undisclosed giving or receiving of unofficial gifts, benefits, or anything of value, in relation to the provision of normal Government services, or in relation to official Government work or business.

- (m) Obtaining or offering secret commissions including kickbacks.
 - (n) Knowingly or deliberately assisting any contractor, vendor or person who is a close relative, friend, or known associate, to win or consistently win Government contracts for goods and services, where it is patently clear that other vendors or persons could have provided such goods and services at a higher quality or lower price, or both.
 - (o) Receiving an amount for travel allowance or per diem, but not travelling for the requisite amount of days.
 - (p) Any other travel related fraud including adjusting approved travel plans for personal reasons that causes additional costs to Government.
 - (q) Accepting a bribe, OR the act of bribing or offering a bribe to an employee whether by another employee or by a third party.
 - (r) Conspiracy or attempt to commit fraud in relation to any of the above.
- (2) An employee who commits an act of fraud may also be liable for prosecution under the *Criminal Offences Act* [Cap 4.04] in addition to disciplinary actions under the Regulations.
- (3) For the avoidance of doubt, a breach of this Fraud Policy is a breach of the *Code of Ethics & Conduct*, and may be disciplined in accordance with the Regulations.

PART III MANAGEMENT OF FRAUD RISKS

11. Responsibility of the Public Service Commission

The Commission has the responsibility to:

- (a) Ensure that all Ministries are committed to promoting and maintaining a working environment free of fraud.
- (b) Support activities and administrative programs that promote and support compliance with this Fraud Policy.
- (c) Ensure that this Fraud Policy is understood and enforced and that all employees are responsible and accountable for their conduct.
- (d) Undertake diligent reference checks during recruitment processes to ensure individuals who have committed fraud in other workplaces are identified.
- (e) Ensure that the processes provided by this Fraud Policy, and the Regulations, are properly supported, implemented, and adhered to.

12. Responsibility of Chief Executive Officers

- (1) The Chief Executive Officer has the overall responsibility and accountability for the identification and prevention of fraud in the MDAs, and must:
- (a) Demonstrate and communicate appropriate models of behavior and attitudes regarding the importance of having a fraud free Ministry and workplace;
 - (b) Put into place appropriate procedures for oversight, internal control, policies, procedures to combat fraud in the Ministry;

- (c) Ensure that all employees are subject to all rules, regulations and internal controls;
 - (d) Establish procedures to ensure compliance with laws and regulations and prevention of fraud;
 - (e) Ensure that all policies and procedures involving thorough background checks before hiring of key personnel, are adhered to;
 - (f) Effectively follow-up on recommendations resulting from external reviews or questions raised from audit reports, financial reports, and any other fraud related reports;
 - (g) Not to direct employees to perform tasks that will likely override management or internal controls;
 - (h) Providing training and awareness of fraud for staff;
 - (i) Disclose unusual practices or any other activities that are likely to be fraudulent. This includes disclosure to the Minister, the Commission, Police, Attorney General or any other appropriate authority;
 - (j) Co-operate with Auditors, independent investigators appointed by the Government, as well as by the Ombudsman, Anti-Corruption Commissioner, or other appropriate authority. and avoid any acts to circumvent any investigation;
 - (k) disclose any conflict of interest in relation to any Ministry matter, to the Commission by filling out and completing the Conflicts of Interest Declaration and Management Form provided under *Annex 2* of this Fraud Policy. Failure to disclose any conflict of interest may result in disciplinary action by the Commission.
- (2) Where the Chief Executive Officer has observed or has been notified of any alleged act of fraud the Chief Executive Officer must take action in accordance with this Policy.
- (3) Where the Chief Executive Officer acts in contravention of, or fails to take any action required by this policy, such Chief Executive Officer shall be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the provisions of this Fraud Policy and the Regulations.

13. Responsibility of Heads of Division

- (1) It is the responsibility of the Head of Divisions to:
- (a) ensure the consistent and correct application of management control processes required to be in their particular Divisions, and specific areas of responsibility;
 - (b) ensure that employees in their division and specific area of responsibility are aware of management procedures and their obligations under this Fraud Policy and the *Code of Ethics & Conduct*;
 - (c) facilitate a culture of honesty and transparency within their division and specific area of responsibility, as well as for the Ministry workplace as a whole, that ensures that employees are not discouraged from questioning events or processes or making a notification about suspected fraud;
 - (d) identify the risks to which the Ministry's systems, operations and procedures that may potentially be exposed to fraud;

- (e) ensure that controls and processes in place in their Divisions and specific areas of responsibility are actively complied with by all employees in that Division;
 - (f) ensure that employees are supported when making notifications of alleged fraud;
 - (g) Support and implement the responsibilities of the Chief Executive Officer contained in Section 12 (1) above, within their Division
- (2) Where the Head of Division has observed or has been notified of an alleged act of fraud and fails to report to the Chief Executive Officer, the Commission (if applicable) or the Attorney General's office, he or she shall be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the Regulations.
- (3) Where the Head of Division has observed or has been notified of any alleged act of fraud the Head of Division must take action in accordance with this Fraud Policy.
- (4) Where the Head of Division acts in contravention of, or fails to take any action required by this policy, such Head of Division shall be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the provisions of this policy and the Regulations.

14. Responsibility of Employees

- (1) All employees must:
- (a) observe and comply with their obligations under this Fraud Policy, the *Code of Ethics & Conduct* and any other relevant policy;
 - (b) behave honestly and with integrity in undertaking their work tasks and activities;
 - (c) report any suspected behaviour of fraud, as soon as practicable, after they become aware of it;
 - (d) report any incident where they suspect any person or employee is aiding and abetting another person to commit fraud.
 - (e) disclose any conflict of interest in relation to any Ministry matter to their Head of Division, or to the Chief Executive Officer in the case of a Head of Division by filling out and completing the Conflicts of Interest Declaration and Management Form provided under *Annex 2* of this Fraud Policy.
- (2) Where an employee acts in contravention of, or fails to take any action required by this policy, such employee shall be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the provisions of this policy and the Regulations.

15. Responsibility of Corporate Services, Procurement, and Human Resources, Divisions (CPHR)

- (1) Employees in CPHR Divisions are particularly responsible for:
- (a) establishing and implementing strict internal controls to counter fraud risks to the Ministry;
 - (b) developing and maintaining effective controls to prevent fraud;
 - (c) facilitating/making arrangements for investigating fraud; and
 - (d) reporting suspected fraudulent activities.

- (2) Where any CPHR employee is aware or suspects an act of fraud and fails to report to the Head of Division or the Chief Executive Officer, he or she shall be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the Regulations.
- (3) It shall be the responsibility of the CPHR to create and update a fraud database and thereby monitor and report to the Commission all fraud complaints that are received, managed and resolved. Such fraud database shall be part of the Chief Executive Officer's 6 monthly report to the Commission unless requested separately.

16. Responsibility of Internal Audit

The Internal Audit shall:

- (a) Assist the evaluation of internal controls by MDAs and provide advice to the Ministry.
- (b) Identify and report to the Ministry on the internal control weaknesses and propose recommendations to strengthen internal systems to minimize the commission of fraudulent acts.
- (c) Where an Internal Audit employee is aware or suspects an act of fraud and fails to report to the Head of Division, the Chief Executive Officer, or the Minister, he or she shall be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the Regulations.

17. Responsibility of Asset Management

(1) Employees responsible for Asset management shall:

- (a) ensure that the MDA's Asset Register is established, and accurately and completely updated at all times.
- (b) review the register on a quarterly basis, and sign and dated.
- (c) perform the physical asset count (stock-take) at the end of each financial year to verify the existence and condition of assets recorded on the asset register as required under Section 5 of the Treasury Instructions 2020.

(2) Where employees responsible for Asset management are aware or suspects an act of fraud and fails to report to the Head of Division or the Chief Executive Officer, he or she shall be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the Regulations.

PART IV REPORTING, INVESTIGATION, AND DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES

18. Reporting an incident of alleged fraud

(1) Any employee who is made aware of an incident of fraud, must report the alleged fraud as soon as practicable to their supervisor or Chief Executive Officer or to the

Commission by filling out and completing the Fraud Report Form provided under *Annex 1* of this Fraud Policy.

- (2) If the incident of fraud relates to the Chief Executive Officer, this shall be reported to the Commission.
- (3) A Chief Executive Officer shall refer a matter to the Commission when there is a conflict of interest by reason of any relationship with the employee or any of the employees involved by filling out and completing the Conflicts of Interest Declaration and Management Form provided under *Annex 2* of this Fraud Policy.
- (4) A report of fraud by an employee shall be in writing and include the following:
 - (a) Details about the incident or act constituting the alleged fraud;
 - (b) Name(s) of person(s) alleged to be involved;
 - (c) Date(s) and time(s) alleged act(s) occurred;
 - (d) Any available documentary evidence, for example, copies of suspected false invoice, a witness statement of what was observed, any photos or screenshot or video taken of the incident of alleged fraud.
- (5) Any report or related documents of the alleged fraud shall be treated with confidentiality.
- (6) The reporting employee may be subjected to disciplinary action if they:
 - (a) Knowingly submit a false report under this Section, or provides intentionally misleading information in relation to such a report.
 - (b) Contact the suspected individual in an effort to determine the facts or otherwise;
 - (c) Discuss the case, facts, suspicions, or allegation with anyone unless specifically required by the Chief Executive Officer or the Commission, where the incident relates to the Chief Executive Officer.
 - (d) Make public any copy of the report whether by posting online, discussing publicly or sharing the copy with others.
- (7) Any other employee may be subjected to disciplinary action if they:
 - (a) Become aware of the matter, and warn the suspected employee whether directly or indirectly;
 - (b) Discuss the case, facts, suspicions, or allegation with anyone unless specifically required by the Chief Executive Officer or the Commission, where the incident relates to the Chief Executive Officer.
 - (c) Make public any copy of the report whether by posting online, discussing publicly or sharing the copy with others.

19. Anonymous and verbal reports of alleged fraud

- (1) Any person may provide an anonymous and/or verbal report of alleged fraud (“fraud report”) to their Supervisor, Head of Division, Chief Executive Officer, or Commission (if an employee), OR to the Chief Executive Officer or Commission (if not an employee).

- (2) The Supervisor, Head of Division, Chief Executive Officer, or the Commission may inquire into such fraud and decide whether to direct:
- (i) such person to declare themselves and provide the report in writing, in accordance with Section 18(1). If such person refuses to comply, their fraud report shall not be processed and no further action shall be taken.
 - (ii) if a person refuses to comply with (i) above, but the Supervisor, Head of Division, Chief Executive Officer decides that such fraud report is serious, and came with substantial evidence to support it, the Supervisor, Head of Division, or Chief Executive Officer shall prepare a fraud report on behalf of the Ministry and submit it to the Commission.
 - (iii) if a fraud report was directly submitted verbally and/or anonymously to the Commission, the Commission shall not process such report, unless the Commission decides that such fraud report is serious, and came with substantial evidence to support it. In such cases, the Commission may conduct its own inquiry and initiate disciplinary procedures. If the Commission decides that the fraud report was minor, the matter shall be referred back to the Ministry to be dealt with according to the Regulations.

20. Written Fraud Report Forms

Upon the receipt of a written fraud report form, the Chief Executive Officer (or Commission as the case may be) shall:

- (i) Review the fraud report form;
- (ii) Determine whether additional information is required;
- (iii) If deemed necessary, inquire further into the matter, including gathering further information, and interviewing persons relevant to the report.

21. Process for Written Fraud Report Forms

After any review, determination or further inquiry under Section 20 above, the Chief Executive Officer (or Commission as the case may be) shall immediately:

- (i) Determine whether fraud has likely been committed, and if so, whether it is a minor or serious breach of discipline.
- (ii) If the Chief Executive Officer determines that fraud is unlikely to have been committed, he shall end the inquiry and record in writing that no further action will be taken.
- (iii) If the Chief Executive Officer determines that fraud was likely committed, but that it was a minor breach of discipline, he shall process the matter in accordance with the Regulations. A record of any action for a minor breach of discipline under this section must also be submitted to the Commission.

- (iv) If the Chief Executive Officer determines that fraud was committed, and that it was a serious breach of discipline, he shall process the matter in accordance with the Regulations.

22. Criminal Offences

At any stage of the process, where it appears to the Supervisor, Head of Division, Chief Executive Officer, or Commission that a criminal offence may have been committed by an employee, the Chief Executive Officer shall also report the matter to the Attorney General's Office and to the Police. This report shall be copied to the Commission.

23. Prevention of Retaliation and Intimidation

- (1) The Government of Tonga has ‘zero-tolerance’ for any acts of retaliation and intimidation against employees or third parties who report fraud in the workplace.
- (2) Any person found to be retaliating against or intimidating those who report fraud will be dealt with in accordance with the law and the appropriate policies of the Commission.
- (3) Procedures to manage and discipline cases of retaliation or intimidation shall follow the Regulations as specified.

3. Taumu’ā

- (a) Fakahoko ha ngaahi founa ngāue mahino ki he lipooti, fakatotolo, mo tautea’i ‘o e kau ngāue ‘oku nau fakahoko ‘a e kākā ‘i he Pule’anga.
- (b) Faka’uhinga’i mo e fakamahino pau ‘a e ngaahi fa’ahinga kākā kehekehe ‘i he Pule’anga.
- (c) Fakamalohia ‘a e tu’utu’uni ngāue ‘a e Pule’anga ki hono ta’ofi ‘o e kākā, koe’uhi ke fakasi’isi’i ‘a e uesia ‘o e mole fakapa’anga, mole ki he me’ā (material) pe mole ‘o e ongoongo lelei’ koe’uhi ko e ngāue kākā.

 - (v) ma'u ai ha lelei; pe
 - (vi) ha ngaahi koloa pe ngāue.
- (3) 'a ia 'e -
- (i) hangatonu pe 'ikai fakahangatonu;
 - (ii) ki he taha taautaha, pe ki ha fa'ahi kehe.

10. Ngaahi Fakatātā 'o e Ngāue Kākā ha taha ngāue

 - (f) To e fakahoko ha ngaahi ngāue koe'uhī ko ha ngaahi fokotu'u atu, ko e ola 'o e ngaahi vakai'i 'i tu'a pe ngaahi fehu'i na'e tuku mai 'e he ngaahi lipooti 'atita, ngaahi lipooti fakapa'anga mo ha ngaahi lipooti felave'i mo e ngāue kākā kehe;
 - (g) Tapu ke tu'utu'uni fakahangatonu ki he kau ngāue ke fakahoko 'a e ngaahi ngāue 'e ala fakahoko ai ha ngaahi ngāue 'oku 'ikai ke fakatatau ki he ngaahi ngāue fakalotongāue;
 - (h) Fakahoko 'a e ngaahi ako mo e ngaahi polokalama ke 'ilo ai 'e he kau ngāue 'a e ngāue kākā;
 - (i) Tuku atu 'a e ngaahi founa ngāue 'oku 'ikai ke angamaheni pe ha ngaahi ngāue 'oku ngalingali ko e ngāue kākā. 'Oku kau ki ai 'a e tuku atu ki he Minisitā, Komisoni, Polisi, 'Ateni Seniale pe ha ma'u mafai taau;
 - (j) Fengāue'aki mo e kau 'Atita, kau fakatotolo tau'ataina kuo fokotu'u 'e he Pule'anga, 'o kau ki ai 'a e 'Omipatimeni, Komisiona 'o e Fakafepaki'i 'o e Ta'efaitotonu, pe ha ma'u mafai taau kehe mo ta'ofi 'a e ngaahi 'ulungaanga 'oku ne fakafe'atungia'i 'a e fakatotolo;
 - (k) Fakahā ha sepaki 'a e kaunga fakataautaha fekau'aki mo ha me'a ha Potungāue, ki he Komisoni 'aki hono faile atu mo fakakakato 'a e Foomu ki he Tokangaekina 'o e Fakahā 'o e Fepaki 'a e Kaunga Fakataautaha 'a ia 'oku tuku atu 'i he *Tepile*

2 ‘o e Tu’utu’uni Ngāue ki he Ngāue Kākā ko ‘eni. ‘E ngofua ki he Komisoni ke tautea ha taha ‘oku ‘ikai kene fakahā ‘a ‘ene sepaki ‘a e kaunga fakataautaha.

 - (d) tala ‘a e ngaahi uesia ki he sisitemi ngāue ‘a e Potungāue, ngaahi ngāue mo e ngaahi founa ngāue’, ‘a ia ‘e malava ai ke hā ai ha ngāue kākā;

 - (c) ‘Aho (ngaahi ‘aho) mo e taimi (ngaahi taimi) ‘oku pehē na’e hoko ai ‘a e ngāue kākā ni;
 - (d) Ngaahi fakamo’oni tohi ‘oku ma’u, ‘o fakatātā ‘aki ‘eni, ngaahi tatau ‘o e ngaahi tohi ‘inivoisi ‘oku pehē ‘oku loi, ngaahi tohi fakamatala fakamo’oni ‘o e me’ā

- na'e hoko, ngaahi la'i'ata pe ngaahi 'ata tatau (screenshot) pe ngaahi vitiō 'o e ngāue kākā na'e pehē na'e hoko.
- (5) Kuo pau ke tauhi 'a e lipooti pe tohi ngāue felave'i mo e ngāue kākā na'e hoko ke malu mo fakapulipuli.
- (6) 'E ngofua ke fakahoko ha tautea ki ha taha ngāue 'oku ne fakahoko ha lipooti 'okapau:
- Na'e fakahoko 'a e lipooti loi 'i he Kupu ni, pe tuku mai ha fakamatala 'i he taumu'a ke takihala'i 'a e lipooti ko ia.
 - Fetu'utaki ki he taha 'oku mahalo'i na'e ngāue kākā, ko e feinga ke fakapapau'i 'a e me'a na'e hoko' pē ha me'a kehe.
 - Fakamatala 'a e me'a, ngaahi mo'oni'ime'a na'e hoko, ngaahi hu'uhu'u mo e ngaahi me'a na'e pehē na'e hoko mo ha taha kehe, tukukehe ka na'e fiema'u fakahangatonu 'e he 'Ofisa Pule Ngāue pe Komisoni, 'okapau na'e felave'i 'a e me'a na'e hoko mo e 'Ofisa Pule Ngāue.
 - Tuku atu ha tatau 'o e lipooti ki he kakai pe koe tuku atu 'i he ope, talanoa 'i ha feitu'u fakapule'anga pe vahevahé ha ngaahi tatau ki ha ni'ihi kehe.
- (7) 'E malava ke tautea'i ha taha ngāue kehe ange, 'okapau na'a nau:
- 'Ilo'i 'a e me'a, pea fakatokanga fakahangatonu pe 'ikai fakahangatonu ia ki he taha ngāue 'oku pehē na'e ngāue kākā.
 - Fakamatala 'a e keisi, mo'oni'i me'a mo e ngaahi me'a na'e mahalo'i na'e hoko ki ha taha kehe, tukukehe ka na'e fiema'u fakahangatonu 'e he 'Ofisa Pule Ngāue pe Komisoni, 'okapau na'e felave'i 'a e me'a na'e hoko mo e 'Ofisa Pule Ngāue.
 - Tuku atu ha tatau 'o e lipooti ki he kakai pe koe tuku atu 'i he ope, talanoa 'i ha feitu'u fakapule'anga pe vahevahé ha ngaahi tatau ki ha ni'ihi kehe.
